

What are some examples of supports that PAC helped provide ---in the years past?

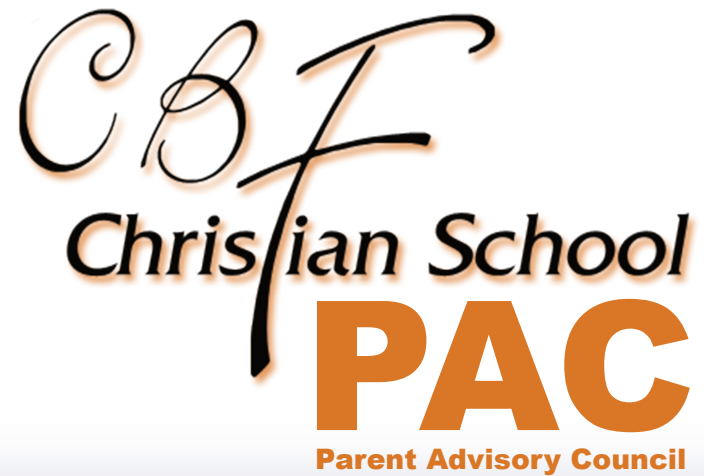
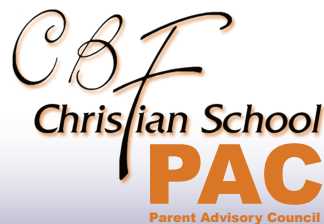

What is the purpose of PAC?

- To support the students, staff and parents of CBFC

Who can be a member of PAC?

- All parents are eligible to be members of PAC.
- Interested community members are welcome to join.
- The principal or another staff member must be present at all meetings and are non-voting members.

Who makes up the PAC Executive Board?

Chairperson, Secretary, Treasurer, Hot lunch Coordinator, and School Representative (Meetings consist of these individuals, as well as the PAC members at large).

Membership Details

- The PAC shall be made up of no less than 7 members.
- The chairperson and at least one other member must be the parent of a student enrolled at CBFC.
- No more than 1/3 of the PAC members can be staff members that are parents. Other members may consist of school parents or be from the community at large.

How does PAC support CBFC?

- PAC meets several times during the year. The board discusses its goals in the first few meetings and then decides how to accomplish those goals.

What kind of goals does PAC set?

- Providing student and staff needs or wish list items such as: technology, art supplies, classroom supplies, playground needs, gym equipment, etc.
- Planning school social events for students, parents, or staff
- Providing support regarding the development of school policies like the school plan or student safety.
- Seeking opportunities for enrichment/extra curricular options for the students.

Where does PAC get \$ to accomplish its goals?

- Fundraising , community donations (Ex: LP Overweight Program, SVCU Mortgage Referral, etc) and applying for grants or community support.

What is the PAC involvement with the Hot Lunch Program?

- The hot lunch program is where parents have the option to purchase a hot lunch for their children, once a week, at a minimal cost.
- Parents are asked to donate food items to help keep costs down. Ex: boxes of spaghetti, canned goods, ground beef, frozen items, etc.
- The school secretary purchases necessary items and cooks the food.

What is the benefit of the Hot Lunch Program?

- The money raised is used to cover field trips costs and provide extra enrichment options for all students.
- The school often averages over 30 field trips per year. Parents do not pay extra for these, tuition can remain lower, and our students receive enriched, hands-on experiences.
- That program also provides extras such as: guided reading books, gym equipment, science equipment, art supplies etc. to support both students and staff.
